Health in All Policies (HiAP)

- 'HiAP' is a key approach to trade and health policies.

"HiAP is an approach to public policies across sectors that systematically takes into account the health implications of decisions, seeks synergies, and avoids harmful health impacts in order to improve population health and health equity." WHO, 2014



Health in All Policies (HiAP)

Based on HiAP's reflected principles, T&H policies should follow the following principles:

- Legitimacy
- Accountability
- Transparency
- Participation
- Sustainability
- Collaboration



Future CB for ITH by HiAP Framework

- Train/Support Health Professional analyze wide range of issues (legal & regulatory aspect of policies)
- Research capacity: Research package by mix skill researchers across sectors working together, keeping up-to-date, future projection
- Build capacity in other ministries/ sectors: proper guidance concerning health impact for their impact assessment
- Build institutional capacity including GHD & ITH workforce capacity in the future : formal education
